They did not remain alone as many of us are today.</div> <div>* The good seeds are the children of God and the field to plant is the world (Matthew 13:38).</div> <div>* We must live by example and our lives should reflect the word of God.</div> <div>* Worldly wisdom and sin will not allow us to multiply, we must get rid of it.</div> <div>* You must also die to self-interest and self-preservation in order to be able to multiply.</div> <div>* For your seed to be multiplied, you must die to disobedience</div> <div>* We are to be conscious of the way we live and dress because it can affect others around us (I Tim. 2:9-10).</div> <div>* We are to be obedient to the word of God and go out to preach the Gospel (Matthew 28:18-20) in order to multiply.</div> <div>* We are to participate in spreading the gospel irrespective of our age.</div> <div>* Young people are encouraged to go out as well the old (Luke 9:23).</div>
