<div>FROM THE PULPIT LAST SUNDAY 01/06/25</div> <div><div>Topic: Fostering Healthy Parent-Child Relationships</div><div>Text: Ephesians 6:1-4; 1 Sam 2:12-18</div><div>Speakers: Engrn. David Adetoro &amp; Mrs. Tolu Kehinde Bankole</div><div><div>• To foster a parent-child relationship, parents should know their children and children also should know their parents very well.</div><div>• Adolescents are not fully children nor adults; they are at the bridge of crossing from childhood to adulthood; not fully matured and still having the traits of children in them. They need to be guided.</div><div>• Sometimes they act as if they don’t need adults but the truth is that they need adults for guidance, support and nurture.</div><div>• There is only one way the children should go and that's the pathway through which they should be brought up by parents (Deut. 6:6-9), i.e. show them the way &amp; don’t spare the rod.</div><div>• The parents’ lives should therefore be an example to the adolescents</div><div>• Parents should not provoke their children to anger (Eph 6:4), show an understand of adolescents’ personality, understand their growth stages and answer their questions to avoid pushing them elsewhere.</div><div>• The family must provide a healthy environment to support godly upbringing; that is open to discussion and creating opportunities to be guided by scripture so all will hear God through his word.</div><div>• Parents can bond with your children by doing Bible study, praying together and doing things commonly together. See children as God sees them, be patient with them and let them know your story.</div><div>• Spend time with your children; show interest in what they do.</div><div>• WWJD should be the underlining principle of our upbringing</div><div>• Jesus being a Son also learned obedience through discipline.</div><div>• Adolescents must take this model for themselves</div><div>• Mary and Joseph took responsibility for Jesus from age 12 to about 30 and Jesus also grew under their watch till he started ministry.</div></div></div>		<div>MISSIONS PRAYER FOCUS FOR JUNE, 2025</div> <div><div>1.
